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The vanished adolescent of our early years, destined to haunt the lofty or thoughtful mind with the mourning he so willingly wears - I recognise him straggling beneath the pain of appearances: because Hamlet brings to life, on stage, the unique protagonist of an intimate, mysterious tragedy, the very sight of his name exerts over me, over you as you read it, a fascination close to anguish.

Shakespeare's play is so skilfully shaped in terms of our inner theatre - prototype of all the others - that it can adjust to today's productions or ignore them with equal indifference.
